Located 15 miles south of San Jose in the Silicon Valley, Oakwood School, founded in 1998, is an independent, co-educational, non-sectarian college preparatory school serving grades preschool through grade 12. Oakwood High School, founded in 2005, is located on the same campus. Oakwood is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Through this more intentional education, Oakwood students grow as expressive, thoughtful, high-achieving, self-aware, considerate young people prepared for their top-choice colleges and meaningful lives as contributing, conscientious community members.

Response to COVID-19

In mid-March 2020, Oakwood School administration, faculty, and staff seamlessly pivoted to remote learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. High academic expectations did not waver, allowing students to meet learning objectives demonstrated through secure assessment. Students who encountered technical challenges were accommodated without sacrificing academic rigor. Hybrid and fully remote options were offered in the 2020-2021 academic year.


The Class of 2024 is made up of 33 students and includes four Commended Students (8.25%).
